## The Kingdom Now and Later

# **Leader Preparation**

This week we see some more of how the Kingdom of God is revealed in Jesus' use of parables.

The parable of the wheat and the weeds draws out some major themes:

- The world NOW contains good and evil side by side.
- The world THEN will have all evil removed from it and God's reign will be complete and obvious.

The illustration of the mustard seed and the yeast also demonstrate that God's Kingdom will be huge, and will permeate every aspect of the world.

Last week may have contained some rather intense discussion around predestination / election in your group. This week also contains some images that can be difficult for us to grasp. Try to focus attention on the key truths and what that means for us, rather than abstract philosophical debates.

Ask God to speak through his holy spirit into the hearts and minds of your group members – cementing in them a firm assurance of his love, sovereignty and good plan.

# Exploring the Passage

#### READ Matthew 13:24-43

## **The Kingdom Now**

- What signs do you see in the world around you that the wheat from the sower and the weeds of the evil one are coexisting?
- Read 2 Peter 3:8-9. What reasons does this passage give for God leaving the wheat and weeds to grow together?
- How can we continue to be salt and light in a world that has been "sabotaged" by evil? How can we make God's Kingdom real to the world around us?

#### **The Kingdom Then**

- Read Romans 8:22-23. Apart from us Christians, what other parts of God's Kingdom are eagerly waiting for the harvest to come?
- Does it make you anxious or relieved to know that everyone will face judgment, and that no evil will be left on earth?
- Do you find it easy or difficult to place your confidence in God's promise of his kingdom on earth?
- What excites you about seeing the fulfilment of God's kingdom?

### **Prayer**

Why not end the evening by saying the Lord's Prayer together. You could each say the version you prefer aloud, or get each person to read a line, leaving a little time for contemplation before going on to the next line.
